
## COLOR THE GARDEN OF HEALTH

Hortus Sanitatis includes hundreds of other illustrations of plants, animals, birds, fish, and minerals. We invite you to view the fully digitized book online!








Botany discussion. Hortus Sanitatis. Mainz, Germany: Jacob Meydenbach, 1491






Discourse on sea animals. Hortus Sanitatis. Mainz, Germany: Jacob Meydenbach, 1491






Use of minerals. Hortus Sanitatis. Mainz, Germany: Jacob Meydenbach, 1491

The wizarding world of *Harry Potter* also values precious stones and jewels. In Potions class, Harry and other students learn to use minerals in making potions.






Study of urine. Hortus Sanitatis. Mainz, Germany: Jacob Meydenbach, 1491
